EPA Lead Requirements for Renovators

(Yes, it pertains to window and door installers)

In case you haven't heard yet, if you are going to replace windows in homes or child occupied buildings that were built before 1978, you will be required by law to be an EPA Certified Lead Renovator and conform to the lead containment and clean-up requirements. Originally there was an "opt-out rule" for homes where no pregnant women or children under the age of six (6) resided. However, the EPA has stated that the rule is being dropped. If you would like more information about the law, go to http://www.epa.gov/lead/pubs/renovation.htm. This law will go into effect on April 22, 2010. The fine for not conforming to this law is \$32,500 per instance, per day that the house is in violation of the law.

In order to become an EPA Certified Lead Renovator, you must attend an eight (8) hour course and pass a written examination. Architectural Testing is currently working toward becoming a training provider; we will notify you when we are approved by the EPA. Homestar Program (Cash for Caulkers)

Thank you to everyone who sent a letter to their federal representatives supporting the proposed Homestar Program. This program will offer tax incentives to anyone who makes energy efficiency improvements to their home, including window installations. However, we all know that the most efficient window in the world will not perform properly if it is not installed correctly. Therefore, it is up to us to point out this fact to our federal representatives.
